

# 21 Days of Prayer 2018 Part 1

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**Luke 11:1 (NKJV)** – <sup>1</sup> Now it came to pass, as He was praying in a certain place, when He ceased, that one of His disciples said to Him, “Lord, teach us to pray, as John also taught his disciples.

**Matthew 6:7-13** – <sup>7</sup> And when you pray, do not use vain repetitions as the heathen do. For they think that they will be heard for their many words. <sup>8</sup> "Therefore do not be like them. For your Father knows the things you have need of before you ask Him. <sup>9</sup> In this manner, therefore, pray: Our Father which art in heaven, Hallowed be thy name. <sup>10</sup> Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done in earth, as it is in heaven. <sup>11</sup> Give us this day our daily bread. <sup>12</sup> And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. <sup>13</sup> And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil: For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen.

This model of prayer can be broken down into many important aspects:

- Prayer is not vain repetitions.
- Because of the sacrifice of Christ, you are able to call God your father.
- When we pray, we should be in awe of who God is and how much He loves us.
- We are to seek first His kingdom, which includes bringing people into the kingdom and filling His house here on the earth.
- He is our provision or daily bread in all things.
- You can't deal with the things of today or even tomorrow until you deal with yesterday.
- Your design reveals your destiny.
- We are to put His kingdom, his power, and his glory first.
