<u>Hebrews 2:14-15</u> "Inasmuch then as the children have partaken of flesh and blood, He Himself likewise **shared in the same**, that through death He might destroy him who had the power of death, that is the devil. And *release* those who through **fear of death** were all their lifetime subject to **bondage.**"

<u>John 1:1-3</u> "In the beginning was the *Word*, and the *Word was with God*, and the *Word was God*. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through Him, and without Him nothing was made that was made."

<u>John 1:14</u> "And the *Word* became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth."

<u>Hebrews 2:16</u> "For indeed He does not give aid to angels, but **He does give aid** to the seed of Abraham."

<u>Hebrews 2:17-18</u> "Therefore in all things He had to be made like His brethren, that He might be a merciful and faithful High Priest in things pertaining to God, to make propitiation for the sins of the people. For in that He Himself has suffered, being tempted, **He is able to aid** those who are tempted."

<u>Hebrews 4:14-15</u> "Seeing then that we have a great High Priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. For we *do not* have a High Priest who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses, but was **in all ways tempted as we are**, yet without sin."

How did He do it? The same way He tells us to do it.

- 1. Constant communion with the Father.
- 2. Acknowledge Him in all our ways.
- 3. Keep His Word before you day and night.
- 4. Do not forsake getting together with other believers.
- 5. A dependency upon His grace, mercy, and forgiveness.

<u>Hebrews 4:16</u> "Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to **help in our time of need**."

<u>Hebrews 3:1</u> "Therefore, holy brethren, *partakers* of the heavenly calling, consider the Apostle and High Priest of our confession, Christ Jesus."

<u>Hebrews 3:14</u> "For we have become *partakers* of Christ if we hold the beginning of our confidence steadfast to the end."

<u>Galatians 2:20</u> "For I have been crucified with Christ, and it is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me."

<u>Galatians 2:20 (Distilled Version)</u> "I consider myself as having died and now enjoying a second existence, which is simply Jesus using my body."

<u>Philippians 2:5-9</u> "Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus, who being in the form of God, did not consider it robbery to be equal with God, (that will rattle your religious thinking) but made Himself of no reputation, taking the form of a bondservant, and coming in the likeness of men. And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself and became obedient to the point of death, even the death of the cross. Therefore God also has exalted Him and given Him the name which is above every name."
