<u>Joshua 4:6-7</u> – ⁶ This is to serve **as a sign among you**. In the future, **when your children ask you**, 'What do these stones mean?' ⁷ **tell them** that the flow of the Jordan was cut off before the ark of the covenant of the LORD. When it crossed the Jordan, the waters of the Jordan were cut off. These stones are to be a memorial to the people of Israel forever."

We have spent three weeks laying memorial stones to mark the work of God for our lives and the next generation.

<u>Joshua 4:9-10</u> – ⁹ Joshua set up the twelve stones that had been in the middle of the Jordan at the spot where the priests who carried the ark of the covenant had stood. And they are there to this day. ¹⁰ Now the priests who carried the ark remained standing in the middle of the Jordan (*a place of supernatural provision*) until everything the LORD had commanded Joshua was done by the people, just as Moses had directed Joshua
