Buffet:

signifies "to strike with clenched hands, to buffet with the fist" (*kolaphos*, "a fist"), Mat 26:67;
Mar 14:65; 1Cr 4:11;2Cr 12:7; 1Pe 2:20.

Biblical usage:

To strike with the fist, give one a blow with the fist; to maltreat, treat with violence and contumely.

It is present tense signifying recurrent action, indicating a constantly repeated attack.

65 Then some of them began to spit at him, and they blindfolded him and beat him with their fists. "Prophesy to us," they jeered. And the guards slapped him as they took him away.

2 Corinthians 12:7-10

The Message (MSG)

7-10Because of the extravagance of those revelations, and so I wouldn't get a big head, I was given the gift of a handicap to keep me in constant touch with my limitations. Satan's angel did his best to get me down; what he in fact did was push me to my knees. No danger then of walking around high and mighty! At first I didn't think of it as a gift, and begged God to remove it. Three times I did that, and then he told me,

My grace is enough; it's all you need.
My strength comes into its own in your weakness.
Once I heard that, I was glad to let it happen. I quit focusing on the handicap and began appreciating the gift. It was a case of Christ's strength moving in on my weakness. Now I take limitations in stride, and with good cheer, these limitations that cut me down to size—abuse, accidents, opposition, bad breaks. I just let Christ take over! And so the weaker I get, the stronger I become.
