## Infinitely More July 29, 2018 | mediaatvictory.com

**Ephesians 3:20 (NLT)** - <sup>20</sup> Now all glory to God, who is able, through his mighty power at work within us, to accomplish infinitely more than we might ask or think.

What is the "infinitely more" God wants to accomplish in and through you? Regardless of where you are today, God still wants to do and is able to do infinitely more. This includes:

- Healing in your body
- You, laying hands on sick and they recover
- Financial increase
- Giving more into the kingdom of God and others than ever before
- Your whole family knowing Jesus

Don't settle for what you've already seen and known, for a "natural" life, or for comfort. Don't spiritualizing "less," thinking that less is humble and blessed, while more is proud and greedy.

The "infinitely more" is directly connected to the degree to which we allow His power to work in us. What might God want to do in your life that you've disqualified yourself from or limited Him?

Mark 6:1-6 (NIV) – ¹ Jesus left there and went to his hometown, accompanied by his disciples. ² When the Sabbath came, he began to teach in the synagogue, and many who heard him were amazed. "Where did this man get these things?" they asked. "What's this wisdom that has been given him? What are these remarkable miracles he is performing? ³ Isn't this the carpenter? Isn't this Mary's son and the brother of James, Joseph, Judas and Simon? Aren't his sisters here with us?" And they took offense at him. ⁴ Jesus said to them, "A prophet is not without honor except in his own town, among his relatives and in his own home." ⁵ He could not do any miracles there, except lay his hands on a few sick people and heal them. ⁶ He was amazed at their lack of faith. Their lack of faith limited what Jesus did among them. A few were still healed, but it wasn't God's best. Some might assume this was what God wanted to do, but it wasn't all that God wanted.

How do we remove the limits? How do we experience the "more" of God?

**Exodus 33:7-11 (NIV)** - <sup>7</sup> Now Moses used to take a tent and pitch it outside the camp some distance away, calling it the "tent of meeting." Anyone inquiring of the LORD would go to the tent of meeting outside the camp. <sup>8</sup> And whenever Moses went out to the tent, all the people rose and stood at the entrances to their tents, watching Moses until he entered the tent. <sup>9</sup> As Moses went into the tent, the pillar of cloud would come down and stay at the entrance, while the LORD spoke with Moses. <sup>10</sup> Whenever the people saw the pillar of cloud standing at the entrance to the tent, they all stood and worshiped, each at the entrance to their tent. <sup>11</sup> The LORD would speak to Moses face to face, as one speaks to a friend. Then Moses would return to the camp, but his young aide Joshua son of Nun did not leave the tent.

## 1. Don't leave the tent.

Meet with God on a continual basis through personal time with Him (Word, worship, prayer), church services, small groups, and serving others.

## 2. See it to believe it.

<u>Numbers 13:1-2 (NIV)</u> – <sup>1</sup> The LORD said to Moses, <sup>2</sup> "Send some men to explore the land of Canaan, which I am giving to the Israelites. From each ancestral tribe send one of its leaders."

It might not be time to possess what God has for you, but you still need to go look at it. It might be beyond what you think you could have or do, but you still need to go look at it. Go get excited about it. See yourself having it, doing it, and being it. It's the conception process.

**Numbers 13:32-33 (NIV)** - <sup>32</sup> And they spread among the Israelites a bad report about the land they had explored. They said, "The land we explored devours those living in it. All the people we saw there are of great size. <sup>33</sup> We saw the Nephilim there. We seemed like grasshoppers in our own eyes, and we looked the same to them."

Numbers 14:6-9 (NIV) - <sup>6</sup> Joshua son of Nun and Caleb son of Jephunneh, who were among those who had explored the land, tore their clothes <sup>7</sup> and said to the entire Israelite assembly, "The land we passed through and explored is exceedingly good. <sup>8</sup> If the Lord is pleased with us, he will lead us into that land, a land flowing with milk and honey, and will give it to us. <sup>9</sup> Only do not rebel against the Lord. And do not be afraid of the people of the land, because we will devour them. Their protection is gone, but the Lord is with us. Do not be afraid of them."

God wants to get a bigger image inside of you.

**Ephesians 1:18 (NIV)** - <sup>18</sup> I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in his holy people,

## 3. Call it like you see it

Joshua 10:7-8 (NIV) - <sup>7</sup>So Joshua marched up from Gilgal with his entire army, including all the best fighting men. <sup>8</sup>The LORD said to Joshua, "Do not be afraid of them; I have given them into your hand. Not one of them will be able to withstand you." <sup>12</sup>On the day the LORD gave the Amorites over to Israel, Joshua said to the LORD in the presence of Israel: "Sun, stand still over Gibeon, and you, moon, over the Valley of Aijalon." <sup>13</sup>So the sun stood still, and the moon stopped, till the nation avenged itself on its enemies, as it is written in the Book of Jashar. The sun stopped in the middle of the sky and delayed going down about a full day. <sup>14</sup>There has never been a day like it before or since, a day when the LORD listened to a human being. Surely the LORD was fighting for Israel!

When you've been lingering and seeing, it's time to start calling and doing. Call it like you see it in God! Call it like you see it in the Word. Call it like the picture He's painted in you. What's God leading you to do? What might be the "more" He has for you?
